VAEEC Receives 501c3 Status

It's nice to get good news in the mail from the IRS! The VAEEC has now received confirmation of our approval as a 501c3 tax-exempt nonprofit. Governor McAuliffe recently appointed his Executive Committee on Energy Efficiency, and we're thrilled to note that four of the 12 members are also on the VAEEC's Governance Board. Congratulations to Cynthia Adams (LEAP), Bill Greenleaf (Virginia Community Capital), David Koogler (Rappahannock Electric Cooperative) and Saifur Rahman (Virginia Tech), and everyone else on the Committee, which also includes additional VAEEC members. The Committee is tasked with developing strategies to meet the state's longstanding voluntary goal of reducing energy consumption in Virginia by 10% over 2006 levels by 2022 - a deadline that the governor has indicated should be moved up to 2020.
