VAEEC Member <u>Viridiant</u> is hosting the first-ever Party for the Planet on **Saturday**, **April 27th**, from **11 AM to 3 PM** at the Historic Tredegar site. The event includes local music, arts and crafts, the Richmond Earth Day 5K *Race Without a Trace* along the James River, and exhibits and activities for both children and adults emphasizing sustainability, health and the environment. Admission is free and

Also slated: "Building Sustainability Conference and Awards" on Thursday, April 25th. Conference tickets are \$45 and available at www.viridiant.org.

And on Friday, April 26th, Viridiant will conduct a free Building Sustainability Tour from noon to 3 PM with stops at an EarthCraft-certified single-family home and multifamily Virginia Supportive Housing project, as well as the LEED-certified Institute for Contemporary Arts at VCU.

VAEEC Member Henrico County will celebrate Earth Day on Monday, April 22nd from 3 to 5 PM with a free Energy Fair at the Eastern Henrico Recreation Center, 1440 N. Laburnum Avenue. The event will provide information on energy and sustainability resources in central Virginia. Refreshments will be available, and free portable power banks for the first 100 attendees. Drive Electric RVA is co-locating their Earth Day event and will have a variety of electric



vehicle models on display including the Tesla Model 3, BMW i3, Chevy Bolt, and the rare Hyundai Kona, among others. Some car owners may offer test rides, and also a local Nissan dealership will be on site offering test drives of a 2018 Leaf.

Almost 30 vendors will be on hand to highlight sustainability, green building, energy efficiency, LED lighting, solar power and recycling. Tech for Troops will collect used electronics, such as mobile phones, tablets, laptops and flat screen monitors, in any condition for refurbishment and donation to veterans. Recap of the Dominion DSM Hearing Before the SCC

The Dominion DSM case was held Wednesday, March 20th before the three Commissioners of the State Corporation Commission (SCC). This was the first case being heard by the new Commissioner, Judge Patricia West. As we explained in our prior blog post, Dominion proposed 11 total DSM programs. The future looks bright for energy efficiency, as the SCC staff and Attorney General's office were "unopposed" to seven programs and had "remaining concerns" about the other four.

Virginia ranked 10th in the nation in overall clean energy hiring, according to a new Clean Energy Jobs report published by the Energy Entrepreneurs (E2). With 42% of all energy jobs and 24% of construction jobs in energy efficiency, Virginia is among the leading states that are creating more opportunities for energy efficiency nationwide.
