



2018 Program Updates

Building Codes

- Latest Uniform Statewide Building Code (USBC) went into effect in September
- Included mandatory mechanical testing for duct leakage
- Created a new compliance pathway with stricter energy requirements, including blower door testing for those who chose that option
- Four new members were added to the Board of Housing and Community Development, including one VAEEC member.

C-PACE

- Arlington officially launched its C-PACE program
- City of Fredericksburg passed their C-PACE ordinance
- The Mid-Atlantic PACE Alliance (MAPA) released their MAPA toolkit, which included a VAEEC-drafted model ordinance
- VAEEC increased our engagement with commercial property owners, managers and developers
- VAEEC began producing maps for localities of eligible C-PACE properties


Utility Programs

- Grid Transformation and Security Act of 2018 (GTSA) passed the General Assembly, which committed the electric utilities to proposing \$1B in energy efficiency programs over the next ten years and created a stakeholder process
- Sent letter to Dominion Energy to propose new measures to include in expanded Energy Share Program
- VAEEC formally intervened in the Dominion Energy and ApCo Energy Efficiency cases with great success




2018 Finances

2019 General Assembly Session

HB 2292/ SB 1662 (Del. Sullivan/ Sen. Wagner)

- Requires the SCC to cite specific work product and analysis in the Final Order when rejecting a EE program or include updated cost-benefit analysis when cutting a proposed program budget.
- Provides an auto-extension to utilities to continue running approved programs beyond the approved duration when there are leftover funds so long as the program remains costeffective.

HB 2293/ SB 1605 (Del. Sullivan/ Sen. Ebbin)

- Ensures that the SCC funded stakeholder group established through the GTSA meets at least twice a year through 2028.
- Requires the independent monitor, who facilitates the stakeholder process, to produce annual reports outlining the objectives and progress of both the group and each electric utility.

HB 2332 (Del. Keam)

 Creates a stakeholder process to review data access issues for consumers and third-parties related to the deployment of

2019 Program Updates

Building Codes

- The next update cycle for the USBC has begun
- VAEEC, our members, and partners will continue advocating for blower door testing for all new homes and other energy codes that put Virginia inline with the 2018 model code
- DHCD is hosting energy subgroup meetings to build consensus for energy proposals
- Public hearing tentatively held in Q4

C-PACE

- Loudoun and Fairfax counties have both passed C-PACE ordinances
- City of Alexandria approved \$75K in start up costs for a C-PACE program in 2020; drafting ordinance now
- City Council of Charlottesville voted to support a climate action resolution, which includes C-PACE
- VAEEC released GIS maps for localities across Virginia
- VAEEC and partners hosting Clean Energy Summit in September

Utility Programs

- Formally intervened in Dominion Energy's energy efficiency proceeding with expert testimony from ACEEE
- SCC APPROVED ALL TEN of DOMINION ENERGY'S ENERGY EFFICIENCY PROGRAMS
- Attended GTSA stakeholder meetings
- Will continue supporting utility-sponsored energy efficiency programs


