# **Board Member Re-Election**





#### Elizabeth Beardsley, U.S. Green Building Council, 2nd Term

Liz is Senior Policy Counsel at the U.S. Green Building Council. Her portfolio includes federal, state, and local green building law and policy issues. Recently her work has focused on connecting building policy to climate mitigation and she represents USGBC at the UNFCCC climate change conferences (COP). She came to

USGBC from the U.S. Government Accountability Office, where she was a Senior Attorney involved in evaluating government environment and energy programs. Liz currently serves as VAEEC Board Secretary.



#### Tim Bernadowski, Siemens Industry, 2nd Term

Since 2006, KC has led Viridiant, first serving as Director of Operations and then as Executive Director. She joined Viridiant as its first employee and helped pioneer Virginia's first state-side green building program. Under her leadership, the organization has helped certify nearly 3,000 homes, 270 low income multifamily

projects representing over 19,000 dwelling units, and continues to grow and promote sustainable growth and resource conservation. KC currently serves as the VAEEC Board Treasurer.

Bill serves as the Energy Manager for the City of Alexandria, where he leads the City's multi-disciplinary Office of Energy Management team – from planning to outreach through implementation – of Alexandria's energy efficiency, clean energy, and other related sustainability initiatives. ### **KEYNOTE SPEAKER**



#### Senator Jennifer McClellan, Virginia State Senate

Jennifer was elected to the Senate of Virginia in 2017 after serving 11 years in the House of Delegates. She has been a leader on clean energy, sponsoring the historic Virginia Clean Economy Act to get Virginia's electric generation to 100% renewable energy by 2045. Jennifer has also used her 15 years of legislative

service to strengthen public education, create criminal justice reform, and combat domestic and sexual violence. Jennifer is also the Chair of the Virginia Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Commission where she works to promote Dr. King's legacy and continue his work, particularly racial, economic and social justice, and community engagement.


